Spring is all around us

Spring is all around us, despite a very wet start to 2024, and there's been an early blessing of bluebells this year, which always lifts the heart. There are two lovely concepts first developed in the Middle Ages which always come to my mind at this time of year; because they are Medieval they are, of course, in Latin, but don't let that put you off! Neither translates easily into English, but they are words to conjure with as the Spring gathers pace around us.

The first is viriditas, an idea developed by the German Abbess and spiritual writer Hildegard of Bingen (1098-1179). It means, literally, 'greenness' but also vitality, fecundity, flourishing, growth, and catches a sense of life bursting into its fullness. When I first flew back from travelling in Africa I remember just how green and lush England looked from the air, an almost overwhelming sense of viriditas hit me, and the experience has been repeated almost every time I've travelled back to this country after being somewhere warmer. For Hildegard viriditas was a sense of the life of God flowing through the world, connecting people and the natural world like the sap running through a tree or plant. She saw it as a healing power, that enables humans to produce all sorts of creative work (she herself was a very skilled musician and her compositions are well worth sampling). The idea of viriditas came briefly to attention during the Pandemic, when so much human activity ceased, the Spring seemed so much more vivid without motor traffic (or perhaps because we had more time to look around us), and places like the polluted canals of Venice gradually flowed with clear water once again, as if nature itself was being healed.

The second idea is *haecceitas*, which the philosopher Duns Scotus ('John the Scot', 1265-1308) or his followers coined to catch the individuality or, literally, 'this-ness' of something. What makes each plant or flower unique? Scotus was not so much interested in classifying and grouping things as exploring what made them, them and observing them in all their own idiosyncratic detail. For him the abundant individuality of the natural world was a marvel that underlined his belief in God's creation of it. The unique pattern of a leaf, the complex colours of the feather on a bird's wing, these are the things that made Scotus wonder. Taking time to look at an individual tree, bird or butterfly and and even, perhaps, ourselves.

seek out its *haecceitas* – stopping briefly on a walk, or just pausing in a garden to do so - can be very rewarding. It might also lead us to reflect on what is special and unique about other people we know too, and even, perhaps, ourselves.

These two ancient concepts both have roots in the Gospel of John, the fourth and deepest of the Gospels, which sees all of creation growing out of the life of God. They come into their own each Spring for me. Let's rejoice in the *viriditas* and *haecceitas* all around us!

WHITCHURCH

Like our homes and farm buildings, our rural churches have constantly needed maintenance. At Easter 1659 parishioners petitioned 'the Lords Commissioners for the custody of the Great Seal' in London for assistance 'with the repairs to the church of Whitechurch'. After 'a late great tempest', 'the whole roof and body of the church' was 'fallen down and the steeple shattered'. They requested £600 (and were permitted to sell two of their three church bells to raise funds). Five years later, 'the parish hath repaired the walles, finished the roof, glazed the Church, and hung up the Bell, and intend speedily to finish what remaines to be done as to the inside of the Church'. Now, after more than three centuries, some of that glazing needs repairing, most urgently, the tracery lights above the east window and the medieval glass in the north and south chancel windows. We've received a generous legacy and another substantial donation but we're still £4000 short of the final cost of £24,000. 


