Desire Paths

A spell of fine weather at last, and what feels like months of muddy dog-walking under leaden skies give way to bright mornings with firm soil underfoot. But where shall we go today?

In our little patch of South Warwickshire we're blessed with plenty of paths to follow, Like many others, I found an unexpected bonus of the Covid lockdowns was the opportunity to get to know the footpaths around where we lived, and I set myself the task of walking all the public footpaths of that parish. Though my walks were, necessarily, solitary (apart from a dog), I became aware that others were travelling these paths too, and sometimes branching off to find their own way. In one place, where a path separated in a Y shape, a new path began to emerge across the top of the Y. It turned out that we were re -opening a very old path that had been disused for decades, which you could see marked on some old maps. I also gradually became aware that there were other, more lightly-trodden paths around, too, as I learned to spot the trails that led to holes in hedges, some foxsized, others big enough for a deer to squeeze through. All sorts of animals were making their way, usually invisible to us humans, with a fine disregard for the official routes. The extra paths, some new, some reclaimed from the past, I found were called 'desire paths', created by gentle feet falling softly on the earth and gradually making a way that became visible to others, and then followed by many.

Some of the oldest 'desire paths' are, of course, pilgrimage routes to sacred places. Those spots, often remote, where saintly figures had been buried, became places to which pilgrims made their way, beating out the paths as they went. These were, if you like, spiritual 'desire paths', and took their inspiration from the ancient Jewish practice of pilgrimage to the Jerusalem Temple each year for Passover. There the pilgrims would sing the 'Psalms of Ascent' (Psalms 120-134) as they slogged up from Jericho, until they reached the top of the hill and saw the city and its Temple laid out before them on the other side of the valley.

In these Summer months, why not turn your feet one fine day for at least one walk into one of the Churches in our group, as a kind of pilgrimage? When you get there, you'll know that many others, many generations ago, have pioneered the 'desire path' to get there, and found something of the presence of God in the cool and calm. Well -behaved dogs are welcome too!



A big Thank You to all those who contributed to 'Tea at the Rectory' on 14 July, running stalls and teas, making cakes and scones, providing plants and a pop-up museum - and coming to spend money too! We raised around £600 for the Downs and Valley Churches.

Nature Notes August 2024

Lavender is a great garden plant to have. It is wonderful for wildlife attracting bees and butterflies to its nectar and pollen providing a natural food source. Bees, in particular, rely on its floral resources for their survival and to support their colonies. By planting lavender, you create a nutritious feeding ground for these beneficial insects. Lavender will provide a natural pest control in your garden and shelter for small insects, spiders etc. It can be dried and used to prevent moth damage to clothes and also beautiful scented sachets. Lavender it is believed can help with headaches, to relax, to treat insect bites etc. In WW1 it was used to disinfect the walls and floors in hospitals. It is also used to favour food, sugar and to make tea. God provided plants for our benefit and many of them are used in modern medicine today. *Gill*




