Coventry Cathedral – 60th Anniversary

On the 25 May 1962, the new Coventry Cathedral opened its doors for the first time and in a service attended by the Queen and led by Michael Ramsey, the Archbishop of Canterbury, the building was consecrated for worship. 'A cathedral for the space age' said the headlines, and its design was striking and innovative. Muriel Griffith, whose husband Michael was vicar of Barford until they retired to Tredington, shared with me recently the experience of having been at that service as a clergy wife. She remarked especially that the smell of the new Cathedral was what struck her – of new concrete, instead of the usual dust-and-sunlight of centuries of so many Cathedrals and old churches. Muriel's memories of that day are clear and it was an exciting time to be there. All of my wife Barbara's family were there too, her brother one of the boys in the choir who followed the shining 1962 pennies set in the floor to keep their procession straight, and Barbara herself as a (very young!) school child in the stands set up in the ruined Cathedral. Fifty years later the Bishop kindly asked me to become a Canon of the Cathedral, and it is a special place for us.

One of the things I love about it as a building is the way it unites old and new, and seeks to reconcile past and present, while also looking to the future. It would have been easy, after the old Cathedral was bombed in 1940, simply to rebuild or to knock the ruins down and start again. But the vision was to keep the ruins as a sign of what humans can do to each other, and build a new Cathedral linked to it as a sign that God is still there despite what humans do to each other. The watchword of the Cathedral from 1940 onwards has been the simple phrase 'Father Forgive'. It was chalked on the ruined altar of the old Cathedral the day after the bombing and even then, in the darkest days of the war, Coventry Cathedral stood as a place of peace and forgiveness. Much of the reconstruction of both the Cathedral and the city of Coventry after 1945 was done with voluntary labour from young Germans.

Parallels with our world today are not hard to find, and I won't labour the point. But you might like to take advantage of the 60th Anniversary to visit what the Dean always rightly calls 'Your Cathedral'. It's well worth a visit, and it's a good place to pray for peace in our own troubled world.

Nature Notes May 2022

A carpet of bluebells in woodland is one of the most spectacular sights to see with their blue/purple flowers there is nothing like it. Almost half the world's bluebells are in the UK. Our bluebell has suffered in some places from the more vigorous introduced Spanish varieties/hybrids out competing our variety. Native bluebells are a distinctive deep-blue colour. Spanish varieties/hybrids are often pale blue or pink. Native bluebell flowers curl back at the petal tips. Spanish varieties/hybrids are splayed. Where can we see these beautiful flowers in May? Nearby Whichford Woods, Long Compton Woods, Dover's Hill Chipping Campden and Oversley Wood, Alcester are a few places. Footfall damage crushes the leaves meaning they cannot photosynthesise and die back from a lack of food so please be careful of where you tread, keeping on the footpaths to protect them. Matthew 6:30 Jesus said that God cares so wonderfully for wildflowers, he will certainly care for us.

Neighbourhood Plan: The Story so Far May 2022

The Regulation 14 Consultation was held during the period 10th January to 21st February. The response across the Parish was not strong but we ended up with 61 members of the Parish completing the questionnaire. The Steering Group have examined all the comments from those residents and the Plan has been amended

where appropriate. In addition to residents, we had to consult some 140 organisations, some of whom replied with no comment, while others offered constructive criticism. Stratford District Council and Warwickshire County Council have also commented in detail and their comments have been analysed and the Plan amended in the light of those comments.

The next stage is for us to finalise the Plan and the supporting documentation before submitting it to the District Council. Once approved the Council will conduct a further consultation before submitting it to the Planning Inspector for final approval. The last stage in the process will be a Parish wide referendum when the Plan will be put to the vote. If you are interested, all the details and supporting documents are, or will be, placed on our web site: www.TredingtonNP.co.uk. Please view the documents so that you are aware of the work being done on your behalf. Planning is crucial in rural communities and, once the Plan is finalised, it will reflect your views and the District Council will be mandated to consult it when considering planning applications in our communities.

Notes from a Small Church in the Field

As you approach the oak door to our church down the path between the double set of sentinel yew trees that flank it, raise your eyes above the entry arch. You will see, set in the stone, a carved stone panel, about twenty inches square. It shows a Paschal Lamb, that is, an Agnus Dei. One rather oddly proportioned leg is bent so the lamb appears to be kneeling. Behind the lamb, a staff is raised, ending in a cross: a typical Saxon motif. A circle, decorated with fleur-de-lis, frames the lamb who faces east, traditionally signifying the resurrection. While the lamb and cross regularly appear in painting and stained glass, the Agnus Dei in stone is a rarity. Indeed, there are only three examples in Warwickshire. Our incumbent in 1907 called our stone lamb 'the most interesting thing in the parish'. It must date from about 1020 and has certainly been reset from an original location. How many worshipers across centuries have entered our church passing beneath the sturdy hooves of our Agnus Dei?
