#### Richard Cooke, the Rector, writes

#### **Resignation of the Archbishop**

There's been a lot of upheaval in the Church of England in the last few weeks. The Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, has announced that he is to step down from his role after many calls for his resignation over his failure to pursue more vigorously a particularly horrific abuser, John Smyth, who he had known himself many years before, though he was unaware of the abuse Smyth perpetrated.

I'm not sure there's anything that I can usefully say on the subject – I have no desire to add to the many voices inside and outside the Church which have offered opinions about the past and the future, what has gone wrong and what changes are needed. Sometimes when terrible mistakes have been made it may be better simply to be silent after accepting responsibility and admitting failure, as the archbishop has done. Then the focus can be where it ought to be, on those who have suffered and in many cases continue to do so psychologically for years afterwards.

Our own group of parishes has had its own taste of being caught up in an abuse case, of course, five years ago when my predecessor as Rector was arrested and subsequently imprisoned. Bishop Ruth, who has been acting Bishop of Coventry in the last year, came to a joint service recently, and has expressed her regret that the parishes were not supported as well as they might have been through that difficult time. I know from talking to a good many people in the villages that this has left emotional scars for some, and an understandable lack of trust in the church. Although I recognise that I may not be the person you'd like to talk to, I am always available to talk about this, or any other issue that you'd like to take up with me.

My hope and prayer is that, whatever is happening at the national level of the Church of England, on the ground, in local parishes, the simple faithful work of pastoral care for all, regular worship and prayer, and love and acceptance, will still be found. At its heart, the mission and message of Jesus was to show God's love to the world, and that, however imperfectly, is what our parish churches are still committed to doing.

#### Sophie Jelley - the New Bishop of Coventry

It was announced on 4 November that Bishop Sophie Jelley, currently the Bishop of Doncaster, will become Bishop of Coventry early in 2025. She will be the first woman to hold the post on a permanent basis. To find out more, see the Diocesan Website – search for 'Diocese of Coventry'.

#### Nature Notes December 2024


The dove with an olive leaf in its beak is seen on many Christmas cards. It was depicted in ancient art. Noah sent the dove out of the Ark three times to see if the flood waters had receded, the second time it came back with an olive leaf. The dove became a symbol of peace when Picasso was approached to design a poster for the World Peace Congress held in Paris in 1949. Since then it has been known as the peace dove. Doves can be found in most countries in the world and mate for life often returning to the same nest site each year. They can navigate over long distances using the Earth's magnetic field. There are several different varieties of doves including the rock, stock, turtle and collared doves, but the one we most think of is the white dove on our Christmas cards. *Gill*




