Remembrance – Silence and Oranges

November comes wreathed in mist and fog, and our thoughts turn to Remembrance. I find that the most moving part of our Remembrance rituals is always the two-minutes' of silence that we observe. It was proposed for the first anniversary of the Armistice that ended hostilities in the First World War and has been observed ever since 1919.

In the rush of contemporary life, the silence can suddenly still us and ask us what all our hurry is really for? I came across the story recently of Thich Nhat Hanh, the Vietnamese Buddhist monk who is sometimes called the 'Father of Mindfulness'. One day he was sitting under a tree with an American friend called James Douglas, having shared some lunch, when he said 'James, I must teach you how to eat an orange.' 'But I have just eaten one' he replied, rather puzzled. 'I'm not sure you did eat it' came the response: 'I noticed that after you peeled the orange you put one segment into your mouth and took another one straight away before swallowing the first. Then as soon as you put that one in your mouth you seized the third segment, and all the time you were thinking about the next thing. So because you were in such a hurry I'm not sure you really ate any of it.'

In the two-minutes' silence we pause and remember, But we also do much more. For those brief 120 seconds we also hear the wind and feel it on our faces, catch the bird-calls and perhaps hear the bleat of a sheep or the bark of a dog that the usual human noise generally drowns out.

That moment, briefly becalmed as the tide of time flows around us, is really I think what we mean by prayer: being conscious of our own smallness and yet, perhaps, comforted by it too. This has always been at the heart of the Christian practice of contemplative prayer. Though there are other forms of prayer too, this one is maybe where we start. There, at that still moment, perhaps you sometimes feel, like me, the presence of God. And then we move on. But the challenge is to retain that stillness somehow as the days and weeks go on and the world winds up to Christmas. Maybe learning to eat an orange might be a good way to start!

Licensing

When Rectors arrive in a group of parishes, they are *instituted*, *induct-ed* and *installed* – which makes us sound a bit like radiators or electrical equipment! That happened to me in late February 2022, but it was as an Interim Minister with a licence limited to three years.

I'm pleased to say that Bishop Ruth, who's the acting Bishop of Coventry, came to a service at Preston-on-Stour on 20th October and extended the licence, which means that I can stay in the parishes beyond next February without a formal time limit. Barbara and I are very grateful to all those who work so hard to keep our 6 churches running and who came to give their support on 20th October and who provided refreshments after the service. It is a privilege to remain here as Rector!

Nature Notes November 2024

In November birds have difficulty finding natural food, they need our help. Bird feeders or a bird table are both helpful. Bird seed, dried meal worms, bird peanuts and fat balls are all enjoyed. We need to keep bird feeders/bird tables and water sources clean to prevent disease, spread by contaminated food and drinking water. Using rubber gloves, remove and bin old food, wash both bird feeders (dismantle them first), and tables with warm soapy water, rinse and dry off. Animal friendly disinfectants are available but rinse and dry after use before refilling. Regular cleaning will help to keep our birds disease-free. In the story of creation Genesis C1 it tells us that God created all kinds of birds on the fifth day to fly across the sky and to multiply and He blessed them. May you be blessed as you care for them. *Gill*

Keeping Public Rights of Way Clear

Ilmington is blessed with having many public footpaths and bridleways within the parish which provide important access and recreational opportunities within the village and the surrounding countryside. In general they are well maintained but occasionally they become overgrown or obstructed. It is important that pathways are kept clear to provide safe and easy passage. Many of the pathways cross or are adjacent to privately owned land. The parish council therefore kindly remind landowners of their responsibilities as follows:

1. Where a public footpath or bridleway crosses private land or is adjacent to private land, the landowners have a responsibility to ensure that there is a clear passageway. This means that hedges, bushes, trees, brambles, crops and other obstructions that inconvenience the passage of walkers, cyclists and horse riders, should be cut back and/or removed by the landowners.

2. Landowners also have a responsibility for maintaining stiles and gateways along public paths and bridleways and help with materials for this may be available from Warwickshire County Council.

We have been fortunate in receiving help to maintain public rights of way over many years from the volunteers of the Cotswold Wardens who have kindly cleared pathways, repaired stiles, and installed kissing gates. Two of our most active local wardens have recently retired, and so we appeal to landowners to make sure they are aware of and fulfilling their legal obligation to keep pathways clear. The Cotswold Voluntary Wardens have limited resources covering the wider Cotswold National Landscape. They can be still called upon to help, but preferably only in circumstances where landowners find it impossible or very difficult to fulfil their obligations.




