

Tim Seller, Hon. Assistant Minister, writes:

Autumn Leaves

We are all very fortunate to live in a beautiful part of Central England. Every season has its own characteristics and attractions. However Autumn brings with it a tiresome problem for every gardener. Leaves. Leaves enhance our surroundings throughout the Summer while they are attached to the branches of the trees and bushes. Then in early Autumn, their colour changes to vivid golds, yellows and browns. Unfortunately, soon after they become a serious nuisance when they fall to the ground. Leaves carpet our lawns and flower beds and their collection and disposal require the less appealing jobs gardeners have to confront. While sweeping up all those leaves, we are unlikely to acknowledge the amazing role they play in God's creation. Everyone who has studied biology knows about photosynthesis, the process by which leaves turn water and carbon dioxide into simple sugars and oxygen using the energy of the sun. Without leaves animal life would not be possible. However it is all too easy to take for granted this fundamental part of our world. God created the world and He entrusted us to care for it and nurture everything on it. It is very clear that in recent years we have not taking our responsibilities seriously enough. Concern about the environment and global warming is growing and thankfully action to combat the worst consequences have begun. These changes to our environment affect us all and we can see examples of them for ourselves in our gardens. For example, in recent years there have been many fewer insects, particularly bees and butterflies, in our gardens than we were used to seeing in the past.

Thankfully there are places that show us what the world would be like if it were looked after properly. In the Galapagos Islands the environment, especially the plants and animals, are given priority. All visitors to the Islands must be escorted by qualified quides. On many of the Islands human beings are allowed in only as temporary visitors; they are not the dominant residents. As a result the wildlife can be seen in great abundance and variety. The animals are very tame and so it is a wonderful place to visit. Famously the Islands were visited by Charles Darwin in 1835. What he saw was God's creation without the interference of human being. The variety of animal life and the ways it differs between the Islands made major contributions of the development of Darwin's Theory of Natural Selection. The theory explains how the animals and plants have evolved into the forms we see today. So the Galapagos Islands show visitors the way God's creation works in our world. I was lucky enough to visit the Galapagos Islands in 2022. It was an amazing experience. I would like to share with you something of my experience there in an illustrated talk on October 10th at 7.30pm in Ilmington Village Hall in aid of Ilmington Church.

Nature Notes October 2024

As temperatures drop food becomes scarce. Bats, hedgehogs and dormice are the only mammals that truly hibernate, waking up the following March/April. Others have different coping strategies. It is essential for them to build up reserves of body fat by feasting, before finding a safe place to hibernate. During hibernation their breathing and heart rate, slow down significantly so they burn less energy. Their body temperature cools so they feel cold to the touch. How can we help our hibernating wildlife?

Leave some messy areas in your garden; piles of leaves, twigs, dead grass for example which hedgehogs will appreciate or maybe buy/ make a hedgehog house. Dormice will make a nest out of dead grass and leaves. Bats will choose a roost (like our local church) or a bat box. At a time when food sources become scarce, hibernation is God's way of enabling His creation to survive. *Gill*



I shall be telling this with a sigh Somewhere ages and ages hence: Two roads diverged in a wood, and I --I took the one less traveled by, And that has made all the difference.


