

Promises, promises...

This July edition of the *Downs and Valley Parishes Magazine* should arrive with you just around election day. It feels as if it's been a long wait...but don't worry, I'm not going to suggest you vote one way or the other. Though my thoughts this month are partly prompted by recognising how fortunate we are to be able to vote, and to do so freely.

In the election campaign it has been noticeable that there's been a strong emphasis on reducing, or at least not increasing, taxes, and very limited engagement with the issue of climate change. In that sense it's been a campaign dominated by negatives, assuming that all of us voters are primarily concerned with keeping what we've got and avoiding sharing it with others; and that we are unconcerned about the world we leave to future generations. Now, I know that a good many people are struggling, especially those with young children who are on low incomes. Stories that I hear from other clergy who run Food Banks, such as the one in Shipston, make that clear. But the emphasis on reducing taxes and ignoring climate change tends to focus on what we don't have, rather than what we do, and that's my concern with it. It feeds a mindset which is the opposite of generous.

What's the alternative? A couple of years ago I came across a fascinating book called *Factfulness* by Hans Rosling, a Swedish doctor. It helpfully shows that the world is actually a much better and more hopeful place than we naturally imagine it to be. To take poverty as an example, the proportion of the world's population living in extreme poverty was around 85% at the start of the 19th century. Today it is around 9%. But what is surprising is that it was only in 1966 that the proportion dropped below 50%, and that since 2000 extreme poverty reduced faster than it had ever done before. At the same time average life expectancy has risen from 31 years in 1800 to around 72 years today, and again the curve has been rising sharply in the last 25 years or so. Even more astonishingly, there is now no country with life expectancy below 50 years. I wouldn't have come close to a right answer if you'd asked me to guess what those statistics were, and nor, apparently, would most people in the Western world.

Rosling puts it more personally when he briefly writes about his own family and looks at the living conditions for the last two or three generations – those who we have some meaningful connection with. When you do that, you can put some faces and names to the way things have improved. Instead of focusing on what we may not be able to have in the future, thinking back like this makes us aware of the incredible changes of the recent past that we so easily take for granted. Survey after survey tends to show that we think things are getting worse. Statistic after statistic tends to show that actually things are improving.

The book is well worth reading, in my view, though beware: it might change how you think! I have obviously hardly done it justice in such a short space. Perhaps its most important and hopeful effect for me is to think that the problems of the world can be tackled and are not as insurmountable as they easily seem to be. The instinct I see being fed in the Election is that most of us are assumed to want to pull up the draw-bridge and not engage with wider issues. And I hope that's not true.

Of course there's an added dimension for me as a Christian. Seeing the world and our society's issues through faith in God makes a difference, because it makes me feel that we are not on our own if God is with us, and the generous nature that we see in Jesus Christ prompts me to believe that there is genuine hope for the future. Let's see what the outcome of the election brings!

Nature Notes July 2024

Have you ever looked at discarded bird feathers? Their amazing membrane like structure, wonderful colours and different shades. We can see from the feather which part of the bird it came from. Wing feathers

are the longest but sometimes tail feathers are too. From the wing feather we can see if it is from the left or right hand wing. The bottom of the feather is fluffy, providing the bird with insulation against the cold. We say the bird has fluffed its feathers up, when it seemingly looks more "dumpy." The wing feathers are wind proof and the tail feathers are used to steer the bird in flight. They are also water proof. As the song says "When Jesus is my portion, A constant friend is He, His eye is on the sparrow, And I know He watches over me". Amen.




